## Ficus Nitida Columns

## Ficus Nitida (Multi-Trunk)



Get the thickest, widest and greenest shade all year long with the Multi-trunk Ficus. Due to their dense growth, Ficus trees provide the most consistent shade of any shade trees grown in Arizona.

## Sissoo Tree



*Dalbergia sissoo*  
Closely resembling an Aspen, the Sissoo is perfectly at home in Arizona and thrives in ultra-hot conditions. These trees grow very rapidly after planting.

## Chilean Mesquite



*Prosopis chilensis (hybrid)*  
A top-selling desert tree, this is a thornless variety of mesquite that provides a lot of shade and grows very fast. They look great and can be planted just about anywhere.

## Tipu Tree



*Tipuana tipu*  
Tipu trees are rapidly becoming one of the most popular varieties in Arizona. It grows incredibly fast, providing an umbrella of shade. They thrive in our summer heat.

## Museum Palo Verde



*Cercidium-parkinsonia hybrid*  
A very fast growing hybrid version of the classic Palo Verde. Provides the unique green trunks of the original only it grows faster, is cleaner, blooms stronger, and has no thorns.

## Shamel Ash



*Fraxinus udhei*  
This is the number one selling ash variety. It is big, has a perfect shape, and grows extremely fast. Plant anywhere that shade is needed.

## Chinese (Evergreen) Elm



*Ulmus parvifolia*

Commonly grown in most of the Southern U.S. for over a century, Chinese Elms still remain a highly popular choice for shade in any landscape application.

## Arizona Ash



*Fraxinus velutina*

This is a large & very fast growing ash. Native to Arizona, it performs well at low elevations & provides maximum shade in the summer while allowing brief sun in the winter during its deciduous period.

## Fan Tex Ash



*Fraxinus velutina 'Fan Tex'*

This medium/large ash variety performs well in the Southern U.S. Slightly rounded in shape and a little smaller than Shamel ash, this shade tree is perfect for almost any residential or commercial application.

## Acacia Saligna



*Acacia saligna*

These Acacias grow a very wide umbrella-shaped canopy that provides filtered shade year round. They are a very fast growing tree with great durability to heat and cold.

## Jacaranda



*Jacaranda mimosifolia*

This is the purple flowering tree seen all across the Southern U.S. blooming in spring. This tree grows very fast and provides a soft, filtered shade with incredible blooms.

## Raywood Ash



*Fraxinus oxycarpa*

This is the darkest green of all the Ash varieties available. During fall, this tree is dominated by a rich burgundy color before its brief deciduous period, giving a much needed "fall" feeling to Arizona.

## Willow Acacia



*Acacia salicina*

Unique silver-blue leaves with a slightly weeping appearance make this tree useful for many landscape styles. Plant anywhere you need a large tree quickly.

## Mimosa



*Albizia julibrissin*

This beautiful rainforest-style tree actually performs very well in the intense sun. Unique pink blooms highlight the tree throughout most of the late Spring, into early Summer.

## Carob Tree



*Ceratonia siliqua*  
Classically umbrella shaped, durable and dark green, this unique tree makes a handsome addition to any yard. Grows well and tolerates even the hottest summer sun.

## Eucalyptus



*Eucalyptus Spp.*  
Ultra-fast growing tree native to Australia, Eucalyptus are suitable for any desert environments and have proven durability, strength & growth.

## African Sumac



*Rhus lancea*  
A wide spreading, durable & fast-growing shade provider that has a large, stately appearance and thrives in intense heat or cold.

## Berrinda Ash



*Fraxinus velutina*  
Rare ash variety that thrives in the hot summer and cold winter months. Common in the Southwest. Provides dense, cooling shade with a near perfect shape.

## Modesto Ash



*Fraxinus velutina*  
This ash variety is very popular because of its bright golden color in the fall. Common in Southwest, it is one of the fastest growing varieties available and makes a great shade tree.

## Bradford Pear



*Pyrus calleryana 'Bradford'*  
This bright green tree features a cascade of snow white flowers during early spring with brilliant red fall foliage. The unique colors of this tree make it an excellent choice for providing shade.

## Cottonwood



*Populus deltoides*  
The cottonwood trees are actually a cotton-less variety, so you can have this fast-growing Valley favorite without the clean-up.

## Eldarica Pine



*Pinus eldarica*  
Known by a variety of names, this is absolutely the best pine to grow in the deserts of the Southwest. Plant safely in gravel or grass yards and enjoy that fresh pine smell every morning.

## 'Red Push' Chinese Pistache



*Pistacia chinensis*  
Becoming increasingly popular around the Valley because of their distinctive fall color. Provides fantastic shade during the summer months.

## California Pepper



*Schinus molle*  
This large evergreen tree provides the incredible weeping appearance of a traditional weeping willow, only it uses a quarter of the water and keeps its leaves all year long.

## Mulga Acacia



*Acacia aneura*  
Native to the arid regions of Australia, this unique, medium size tree is right at home here in the Southwest. Very interesting silver leaves give it the right color for all desert style landscapes.

## Oleander Tree



*Nerium oleander*  
A rare combination of being an evergreen and producing vibrant color makes the Oleander tree useful in many landscapes. It's fantastic for shading in smaller courtyards and patios.

## African Sumac



*Rhus lancea*  
This evergreen tree is great anywhere large shade is desired, as its large umbrella shape provides shade all year long. Always dependable for great shade in any season.

*Podocarpus henkelii*
